


Air National Guard Airmen Redesign Maintenance Stands for F-22

A small team of maintenance Airmen from the Hawaii Air National Guard has revolutionized F-22 Raptor maintenance by developing custom-designed stands for accessing hard-to-reach areas on one of the world's most capable stealth aircraft. "Our Airmen needed something more reliable and user-friendly than ladders and makeshift platforms," explained Master Sgt. Scott Kamali'i, 154th Maintenance Squadron low observable aircraft structural maintenance supervisor. "We saw an opportunity to solve a longstanding issue and improve working conditions for maintainers."

This Week in History: January 9, 1826

While engaging in the pursuit of mutineers from the American whaling ship *Globe*, the schooner *Dolphin*, under the command of Lieutenant John Percival, arrived in Honolulu. It became the first American warship to visit the Sandwich Islands (Hawaii). During the cruise, she assisted men of the American ship *London*, who were ship wrecked in Hawaii, and helped other American citizens in the islands.
