Arleigh Burke-class guided-missile destroyer USS Daniel Inouye (DDG 118) returned to its homeport of Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam after completing a historic 9-month deployment. Friends and family of the ship's crew waited with signs and lei to welcome the Sailors home. The ship is named after Honolulu native Daniel Inouye, a decorated World War II veteran and who was elected as one of Hawaii's first representatives in the U.S. Congress.

## 19th Joint Memorial Service Honors Veterans

The 19th Annual Joint Memorial Service was held last week at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific. The ceremony honors the men who served in the 100th Infantry Battalion, 442nd Regimental Combat Team, Military Intelligence Service, and 1399th Engineer Construction Battalion, who died in World War II or have passed on since. The ceremony is held every September to mark the death of the first Nisei soldier killed in combat — Sgt. Shigeo "Joe" Takata, on Sept. 29, 1943.

Hawaii Gov. Josh Green presided over a transfer of authority ceremony last week to welcome new Adjutant General (TAG) Maj. Gen. Stephen F. Logan of the Hawaii National Guard. "It is made up of our neighbors, our friends, our family members —those who have sworn to serve our state and nation with the highest dedication."



## This Week in History: October 10, 1980

The USS Arizona Memorial Visitor Center was dedicated on the morning of October 10, 1980 after 2 years of construction. The memorial, which opened to the public in 1962 was managed by the Navy until the decision was made to turn management over to the National Park Service with the opening of the new visitor center and museum. The Navy continues to ferry nearly 2 million visitors a year to the USS Arizona Memorial in partnership with NPS.
