This Week in History: November 20, 1916

On Nov. 20, 1916, the Hawaiian Air Office is activated at the Alexander Young Hotel in Honolulu with Capt. John Curry in command. The Hawaiian Air Office represented the earliest establishment of military aviation in the Hawaiian islands. Capt. Curry would eventually recommend Ford Island as the most suitable site for the home base of the 6th Aero Squadron, based on its "excellent approaches and plenty of water for landings and take-offs."
