Missouri is assigned to Submarine Squadron 7 and is capable of supporting various missions, including anti-submarine warfare, strike warfare, special operations forces support, and reconnaissance.



### U.S. Navy Joins 15th Wing in Joint Personnel Rescue Training

Navy sailors from Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron 37 participated in a personnel rescue training event in support of exercise Joint Pacific Multinational Readiness Center 26-1 off the coast of Waianae earlier this month. Exercise JPMRC 26-01 is a large-scale joint and multinational exercise led by the U.S. Army designed to train units and leaders in the region's complex and austere jungle, arctic, and archipelago environments, replicating real-world conditions, contributing to integrated deterrence and regional security in the Indo-Pacific.



### This Week in History: November 28, 1911

The cruiser USS California (ACR 6) arrived in Honolulu Harbor on Nov. 28, 1911. Onboard was Rear-Admiral Chauncey Thomas, commander of the Pacific Fleet. The ship's arrival would soon mark the beginning of a new era in the Navy's history in Hawaii when the California would sail into the newly dredged channel of Pearl Harbor on Dec. 14, 1911, becoming the first large warship to navigate the harbor.
