This Week in History: February 21, 1958

On Feb. 21, 1958, the crew of the USS Gudgeon returned to a hero's welcome after becoming the first American submarine to circumnavigate the globe. The historic cruise departed Pearl Harbor on July 8, 1957, and returned 150 days later after covering a record distance of 23,111 miles.
