## This Week in History: March 7, 1950

On March 7, 1950, Adm. Arthur Radford, the Commander-in-Chief of the U.S. Pacific Fleet ordered a flagstaff to be attached to the mainmast of the existing structure of the USS Arizona. The flag was subsequently raised and lowered daily and ceremonies were held on the wooden platform. A commemorative plaque was also installed at the base of the flagstaff. The same plaque is on display on the USS Arizona Memorial today.
