NCTF-RH continues to engage with residents, regulatory agencies, and other stakeholders as it works to safely and deliberately decommission the RHBFSF.



## Navy Divers Collect USS Arizona Platform Samples

U.S. Navy divers collected samples of concrete last week from one of the mooring platforms attached to the hull of the USS Arizona in Pearl Harbor. The samples will be tested for potential hazardous material. The Navy plans to remove the deteriorating platforms later this year to prevent possible damage to the USS Arizona, its memorial and the environment. The platforms were attached to the ship following the 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor and used to facilitate salvage operations.





## U.S. Pacific Fleet Band Performs at Salt Lake-Moanalua Public Library

On Saturday, the U.S. Pacific Fleet Band Woodwind Quintet performed at Salt Lake-Moanalua Public Library to help kickoff Hawaii State Public Library System's Summer Reading Challenge. Participants complete the challenge by reading 800 minutes or more between June 1 and July 31. This year's theme, "E Heluhelu Kākou – Mele," invites readers to feel the rhythm of reading through poetry, chants, and music. Band performances promote engagement with community and highlight the Navy's presence and professionalism through music.

## This Week in History: June 3-7, 1942

This year marks the 83rd anniversary of the pivotal Battle of Midway, where American naval and air forces defeated a powerful Imperial Japanese fleet intent on invading Midway Atoll. The battle, which occurred June 3 - 7, 1942, turned the tide of war in the Pacific and prevented the Empire of Japan from threatening the Hawaiian Islands from the air base on Midway.
