### NCTF Begins Cleaning Second Set of Red Hill Fuel Tanks

Navy Closure Task Force-Red Hill (NCTF-RH) personnel began cleaning the second set of fuel tanks at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility today. With approval from the Hawaii Department of Health, NCTF-RH started venting tank 6, replicating the process previously used during the venting and initial cleaning of tanks 7 and 8. The venting phase eliminates volatile organic compounds from the tank by pushing clean air from the tank bottom and exhausting it through a complex ventilation system.



### Navy, Coast Guard Rescue Mother, Daughter from Stranded Sailboat

The Navy and U.S. Coast Guard teamed up last week to rescue a woman, her 7-year-old daughter and their pets after high winds and raging seas battered their sailboat. Joint Rescue Coordination Center Honolulu watchstanders requested support from the USS William P. Lawrence (DDG 110), an Arleigh Burke-class guided-missile destroyer homeported at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, after receiving a distress alert from the battered French-flagged vessel 925 miles off the coast of Oahu.



## Chief Selects Spend Week Aboard the Mighty Mo

Forty-four Chief selects are spending this week aboard the Battleship Missouri Memorial as part of the renowned Chief Petty Officer Legacy Academy, a selective leadership-training experience for emerging senior non-commissioned officers in the Navy. The Chief selects will live aboard the historic battleship, learning about everything from CPO history and heritage to leadership and team building. Graduates complete the program with the intent of carrying their experience through to future leadership roles in their units.




### Security Force Assessor Overcomes Obstacles, Inspires Through Leadership
