Eight Sailors assigned to the Arleigh Burke-class guided missile destroyer USS Chung-Hoon (DDG 93) are visiting Hawaii to attend the ship's 20-year commissioning anniversary ceremony. While here, the Sailors are volunteering in the community. Earlier in the week, they removed invasive plants and weeds at He'eia Fishpond in Kaneohe. The warship was named in honor of Rear Adm. Gordon Pai'ea Chung-Hoon, who was of Hawaiian and Asian descent and the first Asian American flag officer.


Navy Fitness Centers Improve Quality of Life for Military, Civilians

This Week in History: September 23, 1912

On Sept. 23, 1912, President Taft issued an executive order closing Pearl Harbor to all commercial shipping of foreign registry, while also greatly restricting American commercial use of the harbor. With the construction of a drydock underway, the United States would begin the process of establishing Pearl Harbor as a world-class naval base, while Honolulu Harbor would continue to serve as Hawaii's commercial port.
